Screening and Prevention

- Non-contact Temperature checks and/or screening questions mandated daily for each child upon entry, with a designated area for the screenings.
- Non-contact Temperature checks and/or screening questions mandated daily for each adult dropping off a child.

Hygiene

- Hand washing for all children upon entry in the morning and at certain intervals throughout the day (e.g. hourly)
- All children, staff, and volunteers should engage in hand hygiene at the following times:
 - Arrival to the facility and after breaks
 - Before and after preparing food or drinks
 - Before and after eating or handling food
 - Before and after administering medication or medical ointment
 - After using the toilet or helping a child use the bathroom
 - After coming in contact with bodily fluid
 - After playing outdoors or in sand
 - After handling garbage
- Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If hands are not visibly dirty, alcohol-based hand sanitizers with at least 60% alcohol can be used if soap and water are not readily available.
- Supervise children when they use hand sanitizer to prevent ingestion.
- Assist children with handwashing, including infants who cannot wash hands alone.
- After assisting children with handwashing, staff should also wash their hands.
- Food preparation and service changes
 - No self-serve snack
 - Individually packaged snacks only
 - Children cannot assist with food prep
- Keeping siblings together to the extent possible
- Cleaning and disinfecting
 - Cleaning of frequently used items (doorknobs, faucets, etc.) at required intervals
 - More frequent laundering of children's cleaning supplies (like towels) or required to be disposable
 - Daily or twice daily full cleaning and sanitizing of bathrooms
 - Shared materials need to be cleaned after each use
- Drop off/pick up procedures
 - Distancing at drop-off and pick-up; staggered drop-off and pick up times

- No parents/guardians allowed in building; children dropped off by the same people every day if possible
- Distancing (work time, napping, mealtime, playground)
 - Children need to have an assigned workspace
 - The school must provide certain materials, like colored pencils, crayons in a 1:1 ratio
 - Cots need to be further apart than currently required in nap areas
 - Cubby areas or storage bins may need must have
- Protocols for a confirmed case of COVID-19
 - Designate a space that will be used to separate children or staff showing symptoms during operating hours
 - Close off areas used by the person who is sick.
 - Open outside doors and windows to increase air circulation in the areas.
 - Wait up to 24 hours or as long as possible before you clean or disinfect to allow respiratory droplets to settle before cleaning and disinfecting.
 - Clean and disinfect all areas used by the person who is sick, such as offices, bathrooms, and common areas.
 - 2-5 day closure for confirmed case (most recent CDC guidelines)
